During the months of September and October, the Friends of the Canastota Public Library begin preparing for the Annual November Book Sale

You can donate gently used books (both paperbacks and hard cover books), CDs, DVDs, and video tapes. The Friends will accept donations for the Annual Book Sale up to two weeks prior to the sale. We, unfortunately, cannot accept any Reader's Digest books, text books, encyclopedias or items that are stained, damaged or musty.

Although the library has an ongoing book sale, this annual book sale offers shoppers a chance to meet with old friends and purchase from a great selection of items. Library commemorative items will also be on sale. Raffle baskets, designed by Friends of the Library, will be donated and sold. Ralston Supply Company will provide the tables that are needed to make this sale happen.

The money raised through this sale is always used to benefit the library's programs, collection or to enhance the building and services that the library offers. Last year's book sale revenues were used as a matching funds donation towards the four Gates Foundation laptop computers that the library received this past summer. Those computers are now part of the library's larger bank of community accessible computers and will be used in group training programs. A portion of the funds raised during last year's book sale was also donated by the Friends of the Library to the library's endowment fund.

This year's event will be held in November on the following days:
Thursday, November 5 from 9 am –
8:30 pm; Friday, November 6 from 9 am – 5 pm; and Saturday, November 7 from 10 am – 4 pm. The event is operated and fully staffed by volunteers of the Friends of the Canastota Public Library.

Volunteers make this event a special one for the library. The group is currently looking for volunteers to help with set-up for the event on Wednesday, November 4th and throughout the entire sale period. If you are interested in helping, please call the library at 697-7030.

EDITORIAL PAGE

FROM THE DIRECTOR:

Aldous Huxley once said, "Most human beings have an infinite capacity for taking things for granted". I am ashamed to admit this is sometimes true of me but my eyes were opened once again during my summer vacation.

At the beginning of August, I visited my college aged daughter in Spain after she finished classes at the University of Barcelona. We had a whirlwind week of 18 hour days trying to cram in as much sightseeing as humanly possible in 95 degree heat. We were surrounded by history, fabulous art and architecture, the gorgeous Mediterranean Sea, delicious food, great music and scads of people (and their pet dogs). But, you couldn't drink the water! Even the locals buy ALL their water in giant sized plastic bottles. We found no working public drinking fountains and there were no water glasses at the restaurants because you have to buy bottled water there too! And 16 ounces could cost as much as 3 Euros (that's about \$4.50).

My daughter's host family asked her to limit shower length, not to shower daily and to reduce her dirty laundry and flushes to conserve water. Hotels and hostels had signage about doing the same. I realized that I took fresh, potable water for granted. I bet many of us in the U.S. do not consider water to be a scarce resource. But, less than 1% of the world's fresh water (or about 0.007% of all water on earth) is readily accessible for direct human use. An American taking a five-minute shower uses more water than the typical person living in a developing country slum uses in a whole day.

So, now I am much more conscious of how I use water in my personal effort to waste less and appreciate it more. You can learn more about this issue from books and the Internet.

Visit us at the library and we'll help you reduce your capacity for taking things for granted.

Recent months have seen area residents laid off or out of work as companies struggle with losses and impending closures. The library does offer help in the way of researching job options,

providing entertainment by borrowing books, movies and magazines and we have books on many different topics including financial assistance and ways to save money!

Here at the library, we know there is even more we can do to help local families and individuals in need. In **November and December**, we will be accepting non-perishable food items in place of **library fines**. We ask that the food donation be commensurate with the fine charged. For example, if a patron owes \$2.00 for a late DVD, an acceptable food donation would be a \$2.00 box of rice. If several books are overdue, an acceptable donation might be a can of soup or vegetables. This will not only help our patrons who might be a bit late on returning items and will help those who are in need. The non-perishable items will stay local! What Is The Value of Your Library?

NYLA (New York Library Association) recently released a Library Use Value Calculator. When you enter your library usage on a weekly, bi-weekly or monthly basis, the system calculates the monthly and annual savings you have made by using the library. Here in Canastota, we talked to several patrons and had them estimate the number of times they use the library on a monthly basis as

well as how many different types of materials and/or services at the library that they use.

One patron indicated that she borrows at least two hardcover books and three magazines each month. As well, she usually borrows two DVDs on a monthly basis. Her library usage value would be approximately \$50 per month or just a little more than \$600 per year.

You can visit www.nyla.org and click on the calculator button on the left hand side of the page. You may be surprised at how much your library saves you on an annual basis!



Art & Music @ The Library

October: Quilts by the Canal Town Quilters will be the featured display for the month of October at the library. This group of 15-20 quilters meets twice each month on the second and fourth Wednesday. The display will feature wall hangings as well as traditional quilts. A reception for the Canal Town Quilters will be held on Saturday, Oct 3rd from 1—3 pm in the Lawson Community Room.

On October 4, a concert is planned with "The Excelsior Cornet Band". "The Excelsior Cornet Band" is



New York State's only authentic Civil War brass band. Founded in 2001, the band consists of a group of upstate New York musicians who are dedicated to the performance of original Civil War music on actual antique brass band instruments of the 1860's period. They will be performing their *Abraham Lincoln Program* on Sun., Oct 4 at 2pm on the second floor of the Library.

November: Wally Johnson will be our artist for **November.** Mr. Johnson has always been an artist. Today his abstract works are executed in oil, acrylic and gouache. Johnson has Parkinson's disease and he finds painting both physically and mentally therapeutic. All of his paintings are for sale and half of the proceeds will be given to the Parkinson's Foundation.

December: Melissa Buneo will display her work at the library during the month of December. Buneo teaches 4 - 8 grade art classes at Canastota Central Schools and taught previously at North Syracuse Central Schools. Art is her passion. Mrs. Buneo has been involved in creating several works of art within our community including the abstract mural downtown, two murals in the school, and a graffiti installment in the Canastota Library with the Canastota Librareens. Her favorite mediums include acrylic, watercolor, clay and ceramic. Buneo's recent work includes a series called "dances of heaven" which uses bright colors contrasting with a silhouette of a dancer.

Library Workshops and Talks



In October, the Canastota Public Library will begin a four week workshop, Job Hunting 101. In this program, our staff will show you library and online resources available as well as help participants create a resume, search for jobs online and apply for online opportunities. The program will be held Tuesday mornings in October from 9:30am until 11am, beginning Oct. 6th and ending Oct. 27. Computer skills are helpful but not necessary for this class. Since space will be limited, sign-ups are necessary. A second session will be offered in November. Call the library at 697-7030 to sign up.

Wednesday, Oct. 21st at 7pm, the library will hold a special presentation on "The Loomis Gang". Learn about this notorious family of outlaws that operated in Central New York from local descendent, Robert Loomis. This event will be held on the second floor of the library and is open to the public.

A Librateens workshop called "Healthy Relationships" will be offered on three consecutive Wednesdays in Nov. (Nov. 4, 11 and 18). Leading the workshop will be Tammy Van Epps and Joann Smith from Liberty Resources' Victims of Violence program. In the workshop, teens (grades 6 and up) will discuss healthy relationships. Librateens meet on Wednesdays from 3—4:30pm.

Did You Know? As a community center, the library works closely with other local organizations. Many groups use our meeting rooms here at the library. Currently, we are the host for a raffle basket to benefit the Students of Canastota Central Schools. Organized by teacher Michaela Muench, the raffle proceeds will assist students who need financial help to attend school trips, the prom, or to buy supplies needed for school. Tickets for the basket are \$1 each and available at the circulation desk.

Ongoing Activities @ The Library

Our Baby Lapsit with Miss Angela includes songs, stories, rhymes and finger plays. This program is an early literacy program and involves both babies and their caregivers. The program will be held on Wednesdays at 10am beginning Oct. 7 and ending Dec. 16.



Pre-School Storytime with Mrs. Liz is for children (aged 3 and older) and includes songs, crafts and a snack. The program returns on Thursday mornings at 10am in the Children's area on the second floor. It will run from Oct. 1 through Dec. 17.

Libra-teens is a teen program for students in grades 6 and up. The group meets every Wednesday afternoon that school is in session, beginning Wed., Oct. 5. 
November 5: No film due to Friends Book Sale

MYaudio2go

The Canastota Public Library has great news for iPod© and iPhone© users who love audio books. With the free OverDrive Media Console v3.2© for Windows, most audio books including Stephenie Meyer's "Twilight," Malcolm Gladwell's "Outliers," and John Grisham's "The Appeal" are compatible with the Windows formatted iPod and iPhone. These and hundreds of other titles can be downloaded free and transferred to these and other popular players.



In addition, MP3 titles are being added to the site on a regular basis. MP3 titles can be downloaded to MACs and transferred to any Mac formatted iPods and iPhones . Even more good news: now that the collection has increased in size, customers may now check out up to 5 titles at a time!

This increasingly popular service is called **MYaudio2go**. You can access the service by clicking on the "Digital Audio" link from Mid-York's homepage (www.midyork.org). This new software provides access to Mid-York's collection of audio books for Windows formatted iPhone and iPod users. With a few clicks and using the built-in Transfer Wizard!, audio books can be sent to a iPod, a Zune, many smart phones, and most other portable players.

MYaudio2go allows you the freedom to enjoy audio books, anytime, anywhere. You can borrow audio books even when your library is closed and there is no need to worry about fines because the file becomes unplayable on the computer when the loan period ends. All you need is your Mid-York Library System card.

"I travel for work and was happy to learn that I can download audio books to my IPod. It makes traveling a bit more enjoyable," noted Jerry Mc Dowell, a patron of the Canastota Library.

The service is jointly funded by the Mid-York Library System and its forty-three member libraries.
